THTD 10200 Foundations of Theatrical Design	This course will provide students with a broad-based understanding of design as a theatrical art, the designers, their process and their responsibilities, the importance of collaboration and communication in theatre, and the skill of articulately presenting their work during oral presentation through 4 areas of theatre design projects: Scenic, Costume, Lighting, and Sound.	Fall 2020 - Present (Every Fall semester)

THTD 19900 Intro to Graphic Design and Art for Performing Arts	Students will be introduced to the responsibilities of designers and the role of graphic design in the performing arts industry. Students will learn and practice the design process from scratch, including thumbnail sketches, rough sketches, comprehensive designs, and the building blocks of the design process. Students will also learn the fundamentals of two-dimensional design, the foundation of art, graphic design, and visual communication for performing arts.	Spring 2026 - Present (Every 2 years)**
THTD 20000 Stagecraft and Scenic Art	This is a lecture and project-based course that focuses on a variety of projects covering basic construction, scenic painting, props design, rigging, introduction to drafting, 3D printing, Virtual Reality (VR), projection, scenic painting, working collaboratively, and oral presentation. This course is designed to provide the students with the tools to understand the purpose and practice of stagecraft in theatre.	Spring 2022
THTD 21000 Drawing and Rendering for Performing Arts	This course will introduce drawing and rendering as tools for effective visual communication in the performing arts. Through projects using various art mediums, from pencil to digital, the course will provide designers and artisans with the basic techniques and skillset required for performing arts.	Spring 2023
THTD 26300 Asian Theatre: From South to East	This course provides a survey of theatrical traditions and dramatic works from Southern and Eastern Asia, encompassing diverse periods, cultural contexts, and nations. Through studying literature, religion, and artistic creation, students will develop a deeper understanding of different world cultures. Through an analysis of the theatrical scripts of various Southern and Eastern Asian countries, as well as the creative expression of Asian theatrical forms, this course will provide comprehensive analytical frameworks that facilitate awareness of how cultures vary and shape human experience.	Fall 2020 - Present (Every 2 years)
THTD 30201 Scenic and Props Design	This course explores the development of scenic and props design as part of the collaborative performance of theatre and dance. To this end, students will develop skills in textual interpretation, designer director/choreographer communication, concept development, and communicating the design to the production staff and crew through sketches, drafting, rendering, and creating 3D models or prototypes (virtual or physical).	Spring 2021-Present (Every 3 years)

THTD 31000 Art of Motion Picture and Sound Editing for Performing Arts	This course introduces motion picture and sound editing for a variety of performing arts genres, and explores how visual storytelling, sound design, and artistic collaboration work together in the production workflow. Course activities and projects provide essential knowledge and practical skills in editing moving images and sound using industry-standard digital hardware, software, and operating systems. Students will develop proficiency in video editing, audio editing, synchronization, sound mixing, and creative storytelling techniques while examining how editing shapes audience perception, narrative structure, rhythm, and meaning in performance-based media. Through hands-on projects, students will learn to create and edit digital content for theatre, dance, music, and interdisciplinary performance contexts.	Fall 2022–Present (Every 3 years)
THTD 31100 Puppetry and Mask Design	This course will explore the relationship between historic puppetry and mask, and how they have translated to modern theatre art. The students will be introduced to masks and puppets used in ancient rituals, religious ceremonies, and social commentary across different countries and cultures. This course will examine the similarities between cultures and periods and understand them through visual research, design, and construction.	Spring 2022-Present (Every 3 years)
THTD 39900 Scenography: Art of Collaborative Design	This course examines scenography as the integrated practice of all theatrical designs, including scenery, costumes, lighting, sound, properties, media, and spatial composition. Students explore how these design areas work together to shape the visual and sensory world of performance in theatre and dance. Through script analysis, research, and conceptual development, students learn to generate unified design ideas and communicate them through sketches, renderings, drafting, and models. Emphasis is placed on collaboration with directors, choreographers, and production teams, as well as on understanding how artistic vision, technical process, and collective decision-making contribute to cohesive storytelling. IDPT-41000-10 APEX Fellowship-Faculty Mentor	APEX Fellowships offer structured and mentored support to students engaged in internships or vocational exploration programs.
